Turtle Facts



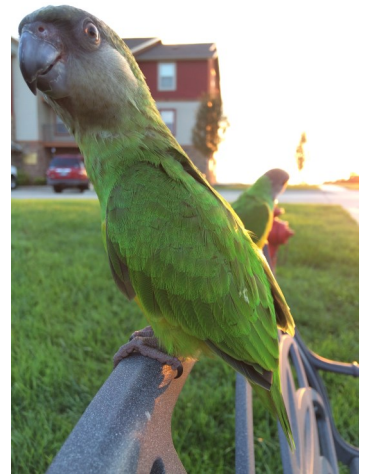
Unlike many other types of turtles, snapping turtles don't have taste buds. It's thought that this allows them to eat food that would otherwise be perceived as poisonous.

Tradition dates the first Thanksgiving meal to the autumn of 1621, when Wampanoag tribe members joined the Pilgrims who'd survived their first year in the new world. Festivities included three days of feasting.

Their feast was probably very different than what we enjoy today for Thanksgiving dinner, however. The Wampanoag provided venison, but turkey was not specifically mentioned by eyewitnesses, nor were mashed potatoes or pumpkin pie.
